RCS Walk-a-thon

Our walk-a-thon is just around the corner, September 25. This is a mandatory fundraiser for all families that did not pay the opt out fee. For families with one child the minimum is \$65, for families with more than one child the minimum is \$90. A pledge sheet is attached to the newsletter. Pledge sheets and the money collected must be turned in by Tuesday, September 22 to be eligible for prizes. If you miss the September 22 deadline you may continue to turn in money until 3:00pm on September 24, but you will not be eligible for any prizes. Any student who has not turned in their pledge form and money by 3:00pm on September 24 will not be allowed to participate in the Walk-a-thon. Students not participating in the walk-a-thon will remain at school.

Hot Lunch

Lunch statements will be sent home at the end of each month. Lunch accounts must be current by the following week for your child to be able to eat a hot lunch. **To keep your account from becoming delinquent you may prepay for lunches.** Please send all money to school in an envelope marked with your child's name, grade and lunch money.

Hot lunches are \$2.30, this includes one milk. Reduced lunches are \$.40 each per child, this includes one milk. Additional milks are \$.25 each. If your child takes an extra milk with their lunch (this is for paid, reduced or free lunches) you will be billed for the additional milk.

To be eligible for free and reduced lunches each family must have an application filled out for the current school year. If you have not filled out an application please contact the school office as soon as possible.
